CPAANT Liaison — Leah Benoit - March 2018

The April 7th CPAANT meeting was hosted by the Mansfield CPAAA. There were approximately 60 people representing 12 cities in attendance. Mansfield CPAAA President Kevin Flynn welcomed everyone to Mansfield. He introduced Chief Tracy Aaron and Chief Aaron welcomed everyone and thanked them for the volunteer work they do in each of their cities. He said police departments could not do everything they do without volunteers. Chief Aaron presented Lt. James Long with his parking sign "Reserved for Lt. Long". Lt. Long was in law enforcement for over 50 years and a longtime member of CPAANT.



The guest speakers were Officers Barry Moore and Thad Pankala, Mansfield Police Department Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) Pilots. UAS includes the actual unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) known as a drone, a ground-based controller and a system of communications between the two. In order to have a UAS program, you must have policies and procedures in place as well as going through pilot courses/school. A start-up UAS could cost around \$20,000 and go up from there depending on the type of batteries used for the UAV and cameras attached to the UAV. The Mansfield Police Department utilizes their UAS in a wide variety of ways – crime and accident scene reconstruction, find escaped prisoners, search and rescue missions, bomb detection, find missing persons and they work closely with canine units saving precious time by eliminating areas to search by the canines. They helped in the case of the murdered teenager from Bedford. The Officers then gave a demonstration flying their UAV in the rotunda of the Mansfield City Hall.

As a reminder, the Texas Citizen Police Academy Alumni and Law Enforcement Annual Training will be held in Allen and will be hosted by the Garland CPAAA. Dates for the convention are August 1st-4th and more information including the registration form can be found at <http://texascpaaa.net/convention/>. The cost to attend is \$125 per person.

EULESS CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY ALUMNI ASSOCIATION Executive Board Meeting Minutes – March 20, 2018

Officers in attendance: Jerri Balkon, Leah Benoit, JR Goad, Dana Nuber, Tom Salmi, and Julie Watkins

Meeting called to order at 6:16 p.m.

We will get to see our award for Volunteer of the Year at this meeting. Julie asked us if we have heard anything about the "safe room" we budgeted for, but no one has heard anything about it. Dana mentioned that we have paid out for the Austin trip and the Washington DC trip for the honor guard. We have spent \$5,976 but budgeted 10,000 so we are fine. JR will do the prayer and pledges. We will mention Vicky Denny's family as a prayer request. She is still holding on.

Old Business

CRUD – JR needs volunteers because of cancellations, so he will pursue that at the beginning of the meeting. Tom Salmi will introduce the speaker, Susanne Hendrickson, who is the Emergency Management Coordinator. She will present the Nixle System to us and teach us how to subscribe to this new Euleless Emergency Alert System. Update on the Volunteer Positions we discussed at the last meeting:

- ☼ The water situation has mostly taken care of itself. Faye and Betty are doing this when they shred on Fridays. It may become necessary to increase this to twice a week as the summer and warmer weather approach. Since Friday they had gone through 5 bottles of water and it is only Tuesday. Julie would like to have at least two more people to be on call for getting water. It still might be cheaper to install water filters in the break room, the 911 kitchen, and the jail food prep area.
- ☼ Can recycling - the price of aluminum has gone from .41 to .55 and this is the first increase in years. We used to make good money doing the can collections and since we did not make any income from the Warrant Round-Up this year we may need the funds. We need to find out if there are any cans behind the fenced in area where we used to store them and find out how we can get in and out of this area to store them and to move them to the recycling center on 29th Street in Ft. Worth. Eric has offered to take the cans to the recycling center and Julie has offered her truck to use to transport the cans as well. Jerri Balkon will ask Rocky how we can access the fenced in area and how often he thinks we should come empty the can container from the break area into the storage area.
- ☼ We still need 2 people to help with vehicle maintenance. The person we need to see is Eric Bessemer.
- ☼ Records has decided to fill their need themselves another way since it requires the NCIC training to do the job and to be kept current with re-training.

New Business

Arbor Daze is coming up April 28th. Police Appreciation Week – mid-May, budget \$1,500. Julie has found some cut-out cookies that are Texas Shaped with black stars on them for the police officers. She wants to include them this year and a client of hers makes them and is offering her a good price. Dana is sending out appeal letters for plates and for gift cards for the BBQ Dine and Dash. Tom needs speaker suggestions. Jerri will send him the list she got last January and the contact information for the speakers group through the DA's office. Leah will get him the contact information on a CPAANT speaker they had recently on the topic of Railroad Crossing Deaths. Leah made the motion to close the meeting and Dana seconded it.

Meeting called to order at 7:06 p.m.

JR Goad led us in prayer and the pledges. Tom Salmi introduced the speaker for the evening. She is Susanna Henderickson. She has been an employee for quite a while but has been in this position about a year. She introduced the Nixle software program that we are using to build stronger communities together. It will be used for tornado, missing child, and missing elderly alerts.

Susan Vest made a motion and Helen Voss seconded it to approve the minutes from the February meeting. The motion was passed. The comment was also made that the budget looks good, but it does not have to be approved.

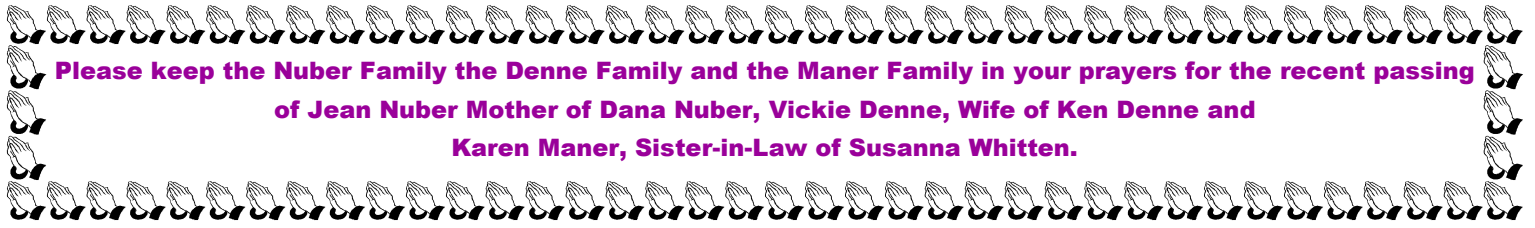
Old Business

CRUD is this Saturday. JR needs at least 3 volunteers to take the place of three people who had to cancel. The volunteers meet outside the library at 8:00 a.m. The volunteers asked to have the list past around the room, so they could verify if they had volunteered or not and add their name if they were able to volunteer to take the place of those who cancelled. Faye, Shawna, Eric, Nan, and Betty Priddy have solved the water problems we discussed last month. Eric and Nan are only able to help with this on Saturday and Faye and Betty will be doing it on their shredding days. The employees are going through at least 10 bottle a week, so they will need to start making 2 water runs a week during the summer and may need to purchase more 5-gallon bottles. It cost \$15 dollars for one of these bottles and .40 to refill it each time. Melody mentioned that the empty 5-gallon bottles are much cheaper at Walmart, so we may need to check the price of these. We may have to increase the budget on this item. There will be help with unloading once the bottles are brought to the police station. We still need 2 or 3 more people to volunteer because of vacations that will be coming up in the summer. The water store is open 6 days a week. Two or three more volunteers are needed for moving the vehicle to the maintenance center. Someone is still needed to gather the cans once a month and take them to the northside recycling center. The price of the cans has just gone up to .55 and this is the first increase in many years. We really need to get this going since we did not have the income from the warrant round-up this year like we usually do. We need to find out where they can be stored and how we access the storage area. Bill Dufinetz offered to take over this project since he used to do it when his son was in the Boy Scouts. He will monitor the cans in the can container, move them to storage, take them to the recycling place, get the cash for the cans, and give it to Dana.

New Business

Police appreciation week is in May. Julie oversees this as well as the usual goodies we give them. She wants to include the pretty police cookies, which a client of hers is willing to give us a great price on to include in our gift bag. Julie will be getting a list of all the officers soon to begin getting this project going. The date for the BBQ is September 29th. The meetings will start in June to begin planning this event. Dana has letters going out to try to procure gift cards and the plates that we will need for the Dine and Dash. She will be trying to get the plates donated by a group. The need is for 8" plates which are the dessert size plates. In June she may be asking us to help locate unusual plates. Julie reminded everyone about the Police Banquet this Friday night. The list of March birthdays was read and Happy Birthday was sung to those who attended the meeting that had birthdays. Dana reminded everyone that ECPAAA yearly dues are past due and need to be turned in to Dana ASAP. She ended the meeting by telling us how Rocky called her to make sure she was attending the Board Banquet. When she arrived, she was taken to her reserved seating which really surprised her. The ECPAAA and the ECFAAA received an award for Volunteer Organization of the Year. After the meeting was adjourned we enjoyed cake and ice cream to celebrate. Tim Stinneford made the motion to adjourn the meeting and Melody Balkon seconded it.

Eules Emergency Alerts

This is a software tool to get information out quickly. You can sign-up at www.nixle.com or text in all capital letters EULESS 888777. It will ask you to text your zip code. You then enter either 76039 or 76040. If you enter 76040 you will need to go to their website later and customize your account or you will receive alerts from both the City of Ft. Worth and the City of Euless. You can also go in to the web widget at eulesstx.gov and sign-up on the city page and messages can be delivered by e-mail, SMS, text message, and via the web. These alerts will be used for tornado/child/elderly alerts.

This is what the city is using for Internal Communications. This will be used to coordinate in-agencies response while notifying residents. They use secure groups, fire, law enforcement, administration, etc. Two-way internal coordination expedites response time. They can send a text and get a reply and rebroadcast national weather service advisories. They will only wake you for urgent weather emergencies otherwise alerts will only come from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. It has reverse 911 technology and they can send a message to all land lines. They can cover 75% of all landlines now. Landlines are becoming a thing of the past. It uses the CASA weather radar. These collaborative adaptive research atmospheres which are set up 25 miles apart and the radars use low altitudes that benefit public safety and commerce. There are 7 of these located across DFW area. The TV radars are 150 miles apart and use altitudes of 3,000 and above. We are able to get their app in Euless, but right now only iPhone and the Android apps will be coming out this spring sometime. The cards we were given have directions to help you to sign-up for Nixel on the front side and the backside will help you to sign-up for CASA. If you are in the 76040-zip code you will need to go into the Nixel official website and sign-up as a resident, log-in, and complete the registration. You then go into my wire, home, locations, add zip codes, home, customize location. Go into settings, city of Euless, take Ft. Worth off your list by unchecking them and you will just have Euless on your list. She gave us each a card with the information of it and told us to sign ourselves up, customize your account in you are in the 76040 zip code, and then give the card to someone else who lives in Euless so that they can also sign-up.
