# From the Desk of Chief Mike Brown

Thanks to all you brave Alumni members who traveled with us to the Chief's Roundtable in Arlington last month. I was so impressed, we had more of our alumni members there than any other alumni group. It was great to see the way each one of our members walked through that event with a real sense of pride in themselves and the organization they represent. I was so proud of each of you and all the great things we have accomplished together. It was good to hear a few new ideas. I really like the one that the Arlington Chief mentioned. They team a volunteer with each one of their investigators. The volunteer, under the direction of the investigator, then calls the victim of each case the investigator is assigned. The volunteer ends up being the face of the Police Department to that victim. Though the Investigator investigates the crime, the volunteer has the opportunity to call the victim back and just check on them on a more personal basis. I would envision that the volunteer would make sure the victim was aware of any crime victim's compensation that they might be entitled to then just be an ear for the victim to talk to. Arlington said that they have been able to solve several cases they thought were unsolvable thanks to the volunteer taking



a few minutes to talk to each victim. I hope we can get enough interest in this type of program to try it with our Investigators.

We just said goodbye to Corporal Jay Alexander. Some of you might not know Jay; he has been the School Resource Officer at Euless Junior High for the last 15 years or more. 
