If the exciting news has not made it to you yet, I would like to take this time to share our upcoming plans. The Chief announced the plans for a new public safety academy. Instead of the police and fire departments running independent citizen academies, we are now going to join forces. The two academies are going to be combined into one. We have several logistical issues to work out, but we will be on track to start the first academy in 2009.

The question arose that if someone has been through one and not the other, can they attend this. The answer is absolutely. The next question that was brought up is if you have been through both, can you go back through this new program. Again, the answer is absolutely. We are going to do everything we can to accommodate those who wish to attend.

We raised more than \$17,000 in 2008!



DECEMBER MEETING: Potluck was discussed and everyone agreed they were interested.

Marie Stevens and Leah Benoit volunteered to produce newsletter. Volunteers needed to help stuff envelopes to the 20 or so members that still receive mailed newsletters. Submissions of articles, photos and stories are welcomed and encouraged.

BUDGET COMMITTEE: Need volunteers for 2009 budget committee. Karen Duncan, Lou Baum, Leah Benoit, and Julie Watkins volunteered.

BUSINESS OF YEAR COMMITTEE:

Committee will need to set date to meet to discuss and determine business and/or individual recipient of award. Committee will meet after the general meeting to set date.

TREASURER AUDITOR: Karen Duncan advised 2007 audit is complete and book back from the auditor. The auditor was concerned about some checks that she believed did not clear, they tuned out to be electronic withdrawals from office supply stores. The auditor suggested books should be kept month to month basis instead of our current method, period ending prior to general meeting. Computer program issue we have been having is cleared; the balance can be updated and corrected.

CPAANT: Geri Sorg updated members on what CPAANT is and when they meet, first Saturday of each month. Confirmed last meeting was in Euless, she advised Mike Brown dave very moving presentation. Mike talked about becoming involved with your City. CPAANT assisted Roanoke is getting their alumni started.

CERT: Lou Baum spoke about the CERT Olympics in McKinney on October 25. 2008. He advised we won 12 gold medals, 5 bronze medals and 1 silver medal. CITIZENS ON PATROL ASSIST A CITIZEN


During last month's ECPAAA meeting, Tim Stinneford, Jerrie Keller and Helen Voss told us of an incident that occurred during one of their patrols.

They were driving along Highway 157 at about 7:30 p.m. one Thursday night and passed The Den. As they drove by, Jerrie said she thought she saw a man dragging a woman to his car, so they turned around and drove into the parking lot. By the time they entered the parking lot, the man had the woman in the passenger seat of his car, and she looked as though she was passed out. Tim rolled down his window to ask the man what was going on and was told that his girlfriend was drunk but that she was OK. Since there were two other patrons of The Den outside who had watched the whole thing and since they did not seem alarmed by what they had witnessed, the patrol team started to leave. However, after they had gotten back onto 157, Helen wondered if a date rape drug may have been used on the woman. The team decided to return.

They called dispatch on the non-emergency number and told them what was going on and asked that a patrol car be sent. By this time, they were parked behind the car in the exit of The Den. They told dispatch that the driver had just left the car, and they had asked him where the woman was. Insofar as they knew, she was still in the car; however, dispatch told them they had just received a report that someone was crawling down 157.

Gerrie and Helen grabbed their vests, saw the woman crawling along the right lane of 157 and proceeded to direct traffic around her. In the meantime, Tim turned on the flashing lights and pulled the car around to protect her from oncoming traffic. Den patrons were also nearby.

Within a few moments, members of both the Police and Fire Departments arrived and took control of the situation. The patrol team then left.
