## CPAANT Liaison — Leah Benoit

The meeting was held at the Grand Prairie Police Department on December 5th and there was approximately 40 people in attendance representing 14 cities. In lieu of a speaker, each city that was present gave an update on what they were doing in the month of December, since many cities have many activities going on around the Christmas holidays.



Euleless will be hosting the CPAANT meeting on Saturday, January 7th. Chief Brown will be in attendance to swear in the 2017 CPAANT Board. We are asking our ECPAAA members to attend, if possible, and bring breakfast items (food, beverages, etc.) The breakfast items will need to be at the Police Department no later than 9:00 am. The CPAANT General Meeting starts at 10:00 am.

Our own Sergeant Todd Murphree will be our guest speaker and he will be presenting a murder case from 2012 that recently went to trial. The murder took place in August of 2012. A missing person report was made on a female in October 2012. Through investigation, including numerous interviews, phone records, and other evidence, the victim was located in November 2012, buried in a field in Kennedale. She was shot multiple times in the head. This case involved drugs, prostitution, burglary, and ultimately homicide. The actual case took over a month of investigation before the body was discovered. The trial took place in September 2016 and resulted in a conviction and sentence of 99 years in the state penitentiary. Todd says it is a good case to review with a ton of moving parts.

**ECPAAA - Minutes from the General Meeting - November 15, 2016**

Sandi Jones called the meeting to order at 6:59 p.m.

Attendees: Jerri Balkon, Melody Balkon, Minuet Balkon, Lou Baum, Leah Benoit, Shawna De Puente, Diana Deering, Tony Deering, John Deithloff, Gary Fields and, Jerry Goad, Paul Haberer, Pete Jones, Sandi Jones, Mark Lee, Molly Maddux, Don Martin, Anniece McKanna, Dana Nuber, Jean Nuber, Judy Rick, Jim Rogerson, Barney Snitz, Geri Sorg, Faye Stinneford, Tim Stinneford, Peggy Vandiver, Helen Voss, Julie Watkins, and Kristi Wynne.

Lou Baum read the prayer his mother wrote. She was a professor at the University of Kansas. This was followed by pledges to the US and the Texas Flag. The minutes from the last meeting were passed out to the members as they came into the room. Sandi asked if there was any discussion or changes needed. A motion was made to accept the minutes as written and Tim Stinneford seconded it. The motion was passed.

**Old Business**

CRUD Day was successful. BBQ Results – Leah thinks we will have made \$16,000 to \$17,000 as a preliminary amount and will probably net \$12,000 after all the expenses come out. We had 57 no-shows who paid for their tickets. We have had a silent auction from 2007 – 2016. A proposal is being

made to have the BBQ again next year, rather than skipping a year, but without having the silent auction. It was suggested that we have 10 big items and have a buy now price. We will definitely continue the Dine and Dash and increase the number of plates we sell. If we decide to have the silent auction it should be in the same big room as the BBQ/Dine and Dash/Live Auction. A two-tier price was recommended with a kid price for tickets. Adult tickets - \$15.00, Kids 12 years and under - \$7.00. Also 0-5 was mentioned as being free, Kids 5 to 10 years - \$5.00. We are losing the attendance of some of the adults because \$15 is too much to spend on a ticket for a child. Jerri Balkon made a motion to have the BBQ every year and Faye Stinneford 2<sup>nd</sup> it. It was suggested instead that we discuss it again each year. We saw poor bidding. A suggestion was made to put pictures on our website of all the auction items and have silent auction bidding like they do on E-bay or Amazon. It was mentioned that the success of Hurst's fundraiser is that every member is required to either sell or purchase 10 tickets to the fundraiser. A motion was made by Shawna and seconded by Helen to have planning committee for next year's BBQ to discuss these options. The Committee will include Nana Nuber, Paul Haberer, Diana Deering, Julie Watkins, Sandi Jones, Helen Voss, Faye Stinneford, and Leah Benoit. The Budget Committee will meet immediately after this meeting in this room.

**New Business**

Rocky and Holly had their baby November 11. Brody Garretson Fimbres was born at 4:20 p.m. and weighted 6 lbs. 14 oz. Sandi passed around her camera with a picture of the baby on it. Peterson said he needs 2 or 3 workers at the beginning and the end of the Parade route for the Christmas Parade but Poteet says we are not needed. The parade was actually cancelled this year because of weather issues. We will be having a dinner next month during our monthly meeting as our Christmas Party. Members are encouraged to bring deserts. We will be providing Christmas Dinner for the both shifts for the Officers and Dispatcher on Duty. Julie Watkins will pick up the food on Christmas Eve and Leah Benoit will come at noon to see that shift A gets to eat and again at 10:30 p.m. to see that shift B gets to eat. Anyone who wants to bring any kind of goodies up during the holidays is encouraged. Voting for the board will take place at the next meeting. Melody Balkon and Rocky Fimbres will be counting the votes. Next month meeting will also include voting for Volunteer of the Year. If you have a nominee you must let Dana know by Thanksgiving so it can be in the newsletter. The list of previous winners was in the last newsletter. Nominees from the floor: Faye Stinneford, Don Martin, and Barney Snitz, Pam Byers – jewelry - Jerrie Keller – can be used as a fund raiser.
