Danny McLain, Information Service Manager of Euless, who has been with the city for 21 years. He is responsible for all of the computers in the city's offices and their Y2K compliance. McLain traveled extensively with his military family but graduated from Grapevine High School. His dad was Chief of Police at one time in Grapevine. He worked in Patrol and CID, and was a training officer before becoming a sergeant in the Euless Police Department. In 1985, McClain became the supervisor over dispatch, records, the jail, property, information systems, and the community services division when it was added later. He was promoted to Lieutenant in that capacity while also working for the

city as Information Services Director. In 1996, he resigned his commission and became the full time Information Services Director for the city.

James Welch owner of the Fair Haven General Store in Weatherford. He has been helping families prepare for Y2K since leaving his job in Fort Worth a year ago. He formerly worked for Lockheed-Martin in Avionics and was the operations manager for landscape and irrigation company. ## CRIME IS DOWN IN EULESS!!!!


CHIEF'S

NEWS

Our final 1998 crime stats are in and we should all be very pleased with the results. Our overall crime fell 9.4% last year. This is down in large part, to the outpouring of community support we have received in the past few years. All of you have played key roles in leading this support effort. In addition, I would be remiss if I didn't point out that we have 111 dedicated Police Department Employees working around the clock each day to make our community a safer place. In 1993 we had 395 burglaries. In 1998 we had 294. You don't have to be a crime analyst to recognize that as a substantial decrease.
