

Dear Friends:

2003 brings to a close the first 50 years of the City of marks the beginning of our next 50 years. We are celebrating our 50th Anniversary by combining our fond memories of the past with our vision for the future. Keeping that theme in mind, over the next 12 months

I'd like to share with you a little of both the past and the future.

The original City Hall was located on the old Hwy. 183, known today as State Hwy. 10 or Euless Blvd. The Woodsman of the World donated the building and property. The small building was on a portion of the site of what is now Fire Station #3. It housed the City Office, Police, and Volunteer Fire De-



partment. A small jail cell was constructed behind the building. It was about 8 feet square and built of cinderblock. This building was utilized until 1967 when the City Hall Complex Gary McKamie was built on Ector. The old City Hall became the first fire station and was utilized until 1990 when it was torn down to make room for the

renovation of an adjoining building for the present Fire Station #3.

The City Hall of today is located in what we now refer to as Euless as a municipality and Building A, in the City Hall Complex. This building was originally built in 1967 as a recreation center. When the Midway Recreation Center was built, all activities and offices were relocated to the new facility and the old recreation center was remodeled as City Hall. The City Council Chamber remained in Building B.

> In 2003 we plan to complete a major renovation of Building A. A new 100 seat Council Chamber will be included to provide comfort and convenience to our citizens. A highlight of the project will be a new front entrance facing Ector. The entrance will include a water feature and other attractive details de-

signed to enhance the Ector Drive view of City Hall and to aid citizens in finding our offices and Council Chambers. This project has been designated as the City's 50th Anniversary Project.





Happy New Year! As we leave behind 2002 and enter 2003, I hope the COPS program will be greeted with renewed enthusiasm. We have a lot of yellow shirts and jackets out there collecting dust. So, if you have one in your closet, take it out and call me to volunteer a time you can go out and patrol. If you have a favorite person, I will certainly schedule you together. Re: 2002 Membership Dues Receipt

Dear Member:

Thank you for paying your 2002 membership dues! We appreciate you being a part of this organization.

As you may already know, membership dues for a non-profit organization may be tax-deductible. However, this year, when you paid your dues, you received an alumni T-shirt for your payment. According to tax laws, the portion of your dues which covered your T-shirt is not tax deductible.

Membership dues are \$20 (unless you joined mid-year). The cost of the shirts were \$8.37 each (12.37 for size 3XL). Therefore, the amount of your membership dues that is tax deductible for 2002 is \$11.63 (7.63 if you received size 3XL). If you were in class 15, you paid half year membership dues of \$10.00, therefore the amount of your dues that is tax deductible for 2002 is \$1.63 (\$0.00 if you received size 3XL).

Again, we appreciate your contributions to the organization and we hope you will continue to be an active part in obtaining our goals: to bring together graduates of the Euless Citizens Police Academy, to improve relations between the police department and the civilian community in all phases of law enforcement activities, and to further the goals and objectives of the Euless Police Department.
