




Membership - Update - Meet Our Members






Faye and Tim Stinneford

J. R. Goad made a special presentation of an aerial view of the PD for our office. J. R. Goad also made a presentation of a new color printer he was able to get donated from Wal-Mart. We all owe our thanks to J.R. and I can hardly wait to try out the new printer on the July newsletter. J. R. mentioned how good Wal-Mart has been to us as you remember we had gift certificates to use for Arbor Daze and what was left was used for the ice cream.

Adis introduced our speaker Sgt. Ron Williamson. Ron has been with the PD for twenty-four years. Currently he supervises Nights A. Previous positions have been Criminal Investigation, Tactical Supervisor and mentor to ECPAAA.

Sgt. Williamsons' program was titled "less lethal". I am sure we all agree it was a very interesting and informative program. The different kinds of "less lethal" weapons were explained in detail and when they were most effective. Subjects discussed were OC Spray, 12 gauge bean bag rounds, Sage gun 37mm for tactical use, shoots wood dowels, hockey type pucks made of soft foam. Two weapons not yet deployed are the pepper ball gun – shoots balls that are harder than paint balls and are filled with OC powder. The newest and latest is the Taser gun. Eules purchased the M26, which has the latest technology. Learning how it works was most interesting. Sgt. Williamson followed with a slide presentation, which demonstrated the effectiveness of the Taser gun. It was most interesting to get first hand information on how the Taser works as many Police Departments are already using this weapon. On completion Sgt. Williamson was available for questions.

David Mishkin told a funny story about appendicitis and the hospital.

Lou had a contest to see how well we read the newsletter. Leah was the first winner with the correct answer for our next Bass Pro workday July 31st.
