Summer is coming!!!

With summer coming and school letting out it's time for the David Hofer Police Summer Camp. I believe we are hosting two camps this summer. If you are interested in help us with those camps please get with Rocky or James, they can get you pointed in the right direction. We always need dedicated and motivated people to help us serve the great kids that come through our camps every summer. Even though it's only a half a day camp, I promise it will feel like you have put in a full day's work if you come out and help us.

With summer on the way we will also see an increase in our Vacation House Watch

request. I know those of you who serve as Citizens on Patrol are well aware of our Vacation House Watch program. We can always use more people driving the neighborhoods in the COP car checking on the houses that are on the list. I cannot say it enough, whenever you volunteer your time to the department you immediately become a force multiplier. Your efforts are vital to us as we strive to keep our patrol units in service and free for calls and other law enforcement activities. If you have not taken the COP course, you can still team up with someone who has and be an extra set of eyes and ears in the car. Now is an exciting time to come on board and work alongside the patrol officers and other first responders as they serve the citizens of Euless.

With summer coming I want to remind everyone to be vigilant at home and in your neighborhood to help us prevent crime. Remember an open garage door might be convenient for you as you are working in your yard or on the house, but it is a HUGE invitation to a criminal. Criminals see an open door as an invitation to come into you home and help themselves to your tools and other belongings. Keep your doors and windows locked at all times. If everyone in town would do that, we could cut our burglary and theft rates in half. Don't forget to apply your crime prevention training to your cars as well. Keep them locked and free from any item that might catch the eye of a criminal. If you MUST leave something of value in your car, put it in the trunk or some other storage compartment, out of sight of anyone just looking for a quick score. If people would do this one simple thing, I believe we could cut our Burglary of Motor Vehicle rate by 80%. Please remember to take care of your property and spread the word to your neighbors, just think of how low our crime rate would be if we could get everyone to adopt these simple but very effective crime prevention strategies.

We have a lot of new faces around here. We have 6 officers in the academy with three of them scheduled to graduate in the next few weeks. We will be busy training new officers for the next year or more!! Stop in and say hello, we always enjoy having our volunteers stop by and spend a few minutes with us. I was recently at Grapevine Police Chief Eddie Salame's retirement reception. During that reception it was obvious that Grapevine has a very active volunteer program and that their volunteers are very active within the department and the community. It reminded me a lot of our program and all the fab-EULESS volunteers that we have here.

Old Business

- Arbor Daze still need volunteers. Julie suggested we just ask, not to pass a sign-up sheet. The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m.

Opened with prayer and pledges led by JR Goad. Our Speaker was our own Chief – Mike Brown giving us an updates and some encouragement. The talk ended at 7:45 p.m. and we went back to the business meeting.

- * "Safe Room" for children with couches and play area is still in the plans but has not happened yet.

- Arbor Daze – Jerri Balkon and Susanna Whitten are manning the ECPAAA booth. Still need more volunteers. If you can help, please give Jerri your name and the time slot you can fill after the meeting.

- Police Appreciation Week will be the middle of May. We have \$1,500 to spend on 97 officers which is an increase of \$500. Special "Back The Blue" cookies have been ordered. Shopping and assembling the bags will occur in May. We will probably assemble the bags after the ECPAAA General Meeting, in the meeting room and put them in the mailboxes before we leave that evening.

- Bill Dufinetz is doing the aluminum cans for the Police Department. Just a few are showing up and he is coming 2X a week to check on them.

- We usually make about \$600 on the Warrant Roundup which is in our budget. Because we did not do that this year, we hope to make up that income with other fundraisers.

- The members that are attending the Prosecutor's Class are, Helen, Glenda and Julie. It is a 12 week class. It meets on Thursday evenings from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. and parking is free. Amy still needs people to enroll in the fall classes.

- May 17th we have an ECPA class graduating and we are trying to get them to come and join the ECPAAA. We will need to assist them with badges/name tags/door codes once they have joined.

- We still have water left on the card and 500 more-gallon card on file. Eric and Nan are getting 8 jugs on Saturday and 3 more bottles give us a total of 14 bottles now.

- Julie mentioned that she and her husband are ordering a brick as a memorial for Ken Denne's wife, Vickie, who recently passed away. Ken has been very active in the past with our organization and known by many members of both the Police Department and Alumni. Julie mentioned that if any other members are interested personally in contributing to the brick, please contact her.

- Monday, May 14th at 7:00 p.m. are the Presidential Awards at the City Hall Council Chambers. Come support the 34 recipients and enjoy a few surprises!

- We announced Leah Benoit leaving the organization at the end of the year or first quarter of next year. She is moving to Tennessee.


- Dues are only 50% paid so far.
