TREASURER'S REPORT: A motion was made by Faye Stinneford to accept the September 2002 Treasurer's Report as stated in the newsletter. Second by Tim Stinneford. Passed. Ruth Zavala asked if the robot would be available for other functions. Cpl. 1. Chris Shanahan reported we now have 79 members.


Newsletter Report:
