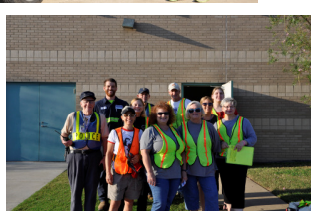
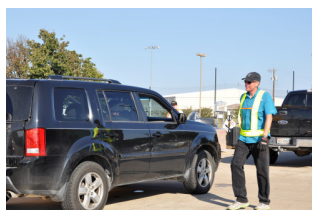

ECPAAA November 21st General Meeting Speaker

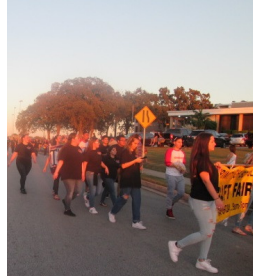

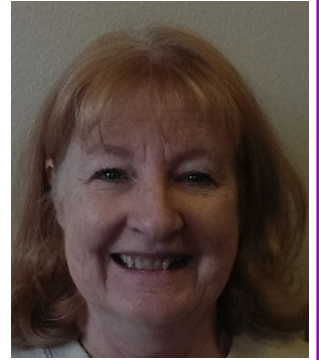


November 21st Meal for our General Meeting - Pizza, Chips, Cake and Drinks

CPAANT Liaison — Leah Benoit - November 2017

The November 4th CPAANT meeting was held in South Arlington. There were 9 member cities with approximately 30 in attendance. The guest speaker was Andrea McElroy, Senior Special Agent with the BNSF Railway Company Police Department. Officer McElroy gave a presentation on Operation Lifesaver – Rail Safety Education. She handed out a folder which contained some statistics on collisions, grade crossing fatalities and trespassing casualties. In 1972 when Operation Lifesaver began, there were approximately 12,000 collisions between trains and motor vehicles annually. By 2014 per preliminary statistics, the number has been reduced by about 81% to 2,286.



A few little facts: A train horn blows at 45 degrees and that's why people don't hear trains coming. Trains travel at speeds between 59 and 79mph. No cell phone usage is allowed by the crew and they can only use the radio to communicate while operating a train. A car traveling 55mph takes 200ft to stop, a school bus 230ft, a semi-truck 300ft, a passenger train like the TRE 600ft and a freight train 5,280ft which equals to 18 football fields or 1 mile. The force of a 30-car freight train hitting your car equals the force of your car crushing an aluminum soda can. Remember, trains always have the right of way.

The State of Texas ranks #1 for highway-rail grade crossing collisions by state with 232 resulting in 82 injuries and 22 deaths (ranking Texas #2 in deaths behind California with 52 deaths). Texas ranks #2 for trespassing casualties by state with 89 resulting in 38 deaths and 51 injuries. Did you know it is illegal to walk on the railroad tracks? It is – railroad property is private property and if you walk on them, you are trespassing. Stay Off! Stay Away! Stay Alive!

The General Meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m. JR Goad led the pray and the pledges to the American and the Texas flags. Jerri Balkon introduced our speaker for the meeting.

Speaker — Arthur Clayton, Assistant Criminal District Attorney for Tarrant County. Social Media: Safety and Consequences

Mr. Clayton has been a prosecutor since 1999. October was Domestic Awareness Month. Bullying kids in school is a big problem. Cell phone use is a factor. Selfies are taken all the time. Criminals take selfies when committing crimes. Mr. Clayton has a 17 year old daughter and a 13 year old son, so he is experienced in the kid department. Don't put selfies on Social Media or define yourself on the opinions of others. There is good attention vs. bad attention. People will be watching you. Here are some of the applications you should be aware of: **KIK**— #1 bad app used by sex offenders, **Snapshot**—2 to 3 minute conversations that go away, but screen shots can be made. **Instagram**—a photo based application, **Twitter**—people get ugly and mean. These are just to name a few, but there are tons more. 1-5 teens have received unwanted sexual invitations. 30% of them are boys and 70% of them are girls. 65% of sex offenders use online info. Playstation Networks, like X-Box Live and My Space are both used by sex offenders to lure kids. They list themselves as someone else pictured as one thing but they are completely different. 3300 sex offenders in Tarrant County, 747,000 in the United States. **Here are some good suggestion about internet access for your kids:** No cell phone or computer access behind closed doors, don't have computers in the bedroom, don't allow smart phone usage in bathrooms or bedrooms, don't accept friend requests from strangers or casual acquaintances, if it is posted it is forever, set privacy settings as high as they can go, don't reveal your personal info on social networks, never, never meet someone in person, do not share. **How can info be used:** make fake ID's, write checks, fake documents. **How can you be found:** school name, license plate, telephone number, cell phone number. Again, just to name a few ways. In fact, Mr. Clayton showed an example of how easy it was to locate and get all the information he wanted on someone in a matter of minutes. This can all be done on the web with the info you put on social media. Mr. Clayton also talked about what cyber bullying was and what if you are bullied. School districts can now investigate bullying and there are legal consequences.

There was a short 5 minute break and the General Meeting resumed at 7:57 pm. The minutes and treasurer reports were accepted with no changes. Melody, Faye and Mia will be calling our members to see who wants to run as an ECPAAA Executive Board Officer. It is important that you attend the November 21st meeting because we will be voting on ECPAAA Volunteer of the year and Officers for 2017. A list of previous members that won will be listed. Send an e-mail to Susanna Whitten with your nomination and a short paragraph. The Eules Police Department Awards Banquet will be in February or March. Julie has the application for the Eules Parade of Lights, which is Saturday, December 2nd. Susanna Whitten indicated she was interested in entering the ECPAAA in the parade and use the COP car and hold the banner in the front of the car. She has clown outfits, make-up, and decorations.
