What a great evening we had at the CPAAA BBQ and Auction. That might have been the largest crowd ever. I do not have a clue of how much money it generated for the ECPAAA, but I'm thinking they will be happy with the final total. This has truly become a community event. There are people from all across Euless, and even the surrounding communities who come out and support the ECPAAA and the Euless Police Department. The food was great as usual, thanks to Assistant Chief Landers' secret recipe on the BBQ and all the fixings that were made by the Alumni members. We even had one comment from an attendee who thought the meal was catered, because of the quality and presentation of the meal. It was

a great night to see people you haven't seen in a while, to meet new people and make new friends. I think this event has become a lot bigger than anyone ever imagined it would. All of that is thanks to each of you who come and help plan the event, gather prizes for the auction, cook food or bake cookies, and those true saints who come in Saturday morning, roll up their sleeves and don't stop working until the last chair is stacked and the floor is mopped. I know this because the BBQ event get larger each year and takes more effort to make it happen. Thank you for making it happen, and to those of you who came on Saturday ready to work. 

### General Meeting Minutes Euless Citizen Police Academy Alumni Association September 17, 2019

Gene led the membership in prayer and in the pledges of allegiance to the flags of the United States and Texas. He then introduced our guest speaker, Senior Corporal Robert Provost, who talked to us about drones used by the Euless Police Department.

A few of the points made by Senior Corporal Provost follow:

All Euless Police Department pilots are licensed. Because Euless' pilots are licensed and because of their extensive training, Euless drones can fly closer to the airport than others can. The drone program became operational in February of this year, The licensed officers have assisted Euless, Colleyville and other area communities with Arial views of traffic accidents and crashes, facility layouts, searches, etc. Officers Provost and Chaney then took two of the drones outside and demonstrated their abilities.

#### OLD BUSINESS

Gene explained the absences of Lou Baum and J. R. Goad. Lou was attending a meeting of the Morrisdale community group in the court area. He then gave us an update on Kay Goad's condition. Gene told the membership that Kay had been transferred to the Forum Parkway Health & Rehabilitation Center, 2112 Forum Parkway, Room 205, in Bedford, Texas. Apparently, this facility is located behind the Holiday Inn on the 121 Frontage near Westpark. Gene then told us that prayers were requested and visitors would be welcomed.

Jerry Balkon announced that volunteer sign-up sheets for the Open House and National Night Out were on the table in the back.

The minutes for the meeting of August 20 were approved, and there were no questions about the treasurer's report.

<u>Bricks</u> – Gene announced they would start laying bricks on Saturday, October 12, between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. He asked for volunteers to come and assist. He said a girl scout troop will join the boy scout troop in providing assistance. City employees, including code enforcement officers, will be assisting as well. Gene plans to ask the Mayor and other city officials to join in.

<u>Auction/BBQ</u> – Dana gave us an update on the preparations. She asked the membership to provide desserts. The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, September 25, at 6:30 p.m. in the training room of EPD. Any additional gift cards that members want to donate can be left in the ECPAAA office. Gene asked that members who still had tickets to account for them, i.e., turn monies collect over to the treasurer and let her know how many they have left. This information will be used to determine how much food and other items need to be purchased. In addition, volunteers were asked to come to the Family Life Center on Friday, September 27, at 4:00 p.m. to help clean the facility and set it up for the BBQ,

Coffee with a Cop – The next event is scheduled for Wednesday, October 2, at Chick-fil-A between 9:30 – 10:30 a.m.

<u>Open House</u> – The bag of empty aluminum cans will be taken away as part of the facility clean-up; however, members were asked to put any additional cans in the ECPAAA office. Pam Shawl will post of list of areas that should be cleans prior to the Open House. She asked that volunteers pick an area to clean, and sign their name on the list indicating that the area had been cleaned. The list will be posted on September 27. She and Gene will try to finish what has not be done.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Mia suggested that we plan to sell tee shirts in the future. Betty Priddy then indicated that the fire department calendars were now available and would be sold during the Open House on October 5.
